

Juston Elden

Justin Elden works for the St. Louis Zoo Herpetology department where he cares for many endangered species of reptile and amphibian, with an emphasis on Vipers. He is also the founder of the Highlands & Islands Conservatory non-profit that is dedicated to the study and conservation of rare herps and their habitats.

James Brumley

Jim's store the Exotic A.R.C. has been in business at it's present location since 1995. He specialize in producing large quantities of his own captive bred reptiles. He is a past president of the St. Louis Herpetological Society.



Joe Hupp

Joe Hupp has kept reptiles and amphibians since he was a child with his father. He's been actively breeding reptile for over 25 years and has been specializing in geckos for 17 years. He's produced over 160 species of reptiles and amphibians. A little over 100 of those species are geckos.

Professionally, he spent over 2 years in the aquatic & herp division at the St. Louis Zoo as an intern and seasonal keeper. He's also been a data collector for the Missouri Department of Conservation for a foreignly introduced pest as well as a breeding data collection for Mexican gray wolves for the Wild canid research & survival center. He currently owns & operates Joe Hupp Geckos.

John Richards

John Richards grew up a turtle enthusiast from a very early age. Growing up in Kansas City his fascination only increased with age and he started Loggerhead Acres Turtle Farm in 1995 which continues to this day. He will discuss his life and career working with the alligator snapping turtle as well as his observations and natural history of the species.

Patrick Nabors

The Nature of Frog Keeping - An exploration of frogs, terrariums and why keeping frogs is so different from keeping most reptiles!

Patrick Nabors has bred around 150 different species of frogs, lizards and snakes over the past 28 years. For the past 20 years the focus has been frogs and poison dart frogs, as well as terrariums and plants. Animals and supplies produced are offered for sale via the website Saurian.net, and over the years, Saurian has sold animals to dozens of US and international zoos and institutions, as well as thousands of hobbyists.

Currently the breeding facility is located in Overland Park Kansas, where forty or so species and forms of frogs are being bred, as well as a few gecko species.



Jeff Briggler

Jeff Briggler has been the State Herpetologist for the Missouri Department of Conservation since 2000. He received a MS and Ph.D. degree from the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville with a focus on pond breeding amphibians. Jeff spends the majority of time promoting, conserving, and monitoring amphibian and reptile populations in Missouri. He has been working on and leading hellbender conservation efforts since 2001 in Missouri. For his work on hellbenders, he received the 2012 Saint Louis Zoo Conservation Award and the 2014 PARC Allison Haskell Award for excellence in herpetofaunal conservation. He has published over 40 articles related to hellbenders.
